Dick Miller & Cliff Jones to be Honored for Service to Community

HARRISBURG, PA (March 16, 2007) – On Monday, March 26, 2007, The Modern Transit Partnership (MTP) will hold its annual Transit Breakfast fundraiser at the Hershey Lodge, this year honoring Dick Miller and Cliff Jones for their service to the community in general, and to transportation issues in south central Pennsylvania, in particular. Both gentlemen have been instrumental in furthering transportation issues in the region with service to Capital Area Transit (CAT) and the MTP.

Dick Miller, Senior Vice President for Benatec Associates, a regional engineering firm, served on the Board of CAT for 21 years, over 17 of those years as its Chairman. He retired from the CAT Board at the end of December, 2006. During his tenure, CAT expanded its bus service to 26 routes and instigated the study and pursuit of a regional multi-modal mass transit system with a regional rail component known as *CORRIDORone*. Miller has also served on the MTP Board since its inception in 1997, and continues in that capacity.

Cliff Jones has served in a myriad of elected and appointed offices within Pennsylvania government over his long and distinguished career, in addition to serving in numerous executive positions throughout the region. He also is a charter member of the MTP Board of Directors, and has been instrumental in advancing the cause of multi-modal mass transit in the region

through the study and promotion of CORRIDORone. In December, 2006, Jones was honored by the Pennsylvania Society with their annual Citizen Award.

CAT also provides paratransit service to citizens of Dauphin County.
